School Uniform

Irthington Village School expects all pupils to wear the Irthington Village School uniform at all times during the school year. Uniform is optional for Nursery pupils.

The uniform has been kept simple so that it is easy to find and buy via the school and to keep the cost of uniform to the minimum.

Parents are expected to send their children into school correctly dressed and we ask that you inform us by telephone or in writing if, for any reason, the appropriate school uniform cannot be worn.

Uniform.

Black or grey trousers, shorts or skirt.

Red Irthington Village School polo shirt or plain red cotton polo shirt

Gingham summer dress in red or blue/white check

Irthington Village School sweatshirt

White, grey or black plain socks or tights (plain grey, black, navy or red)

Flat, black school shoes, no heels or trainers.

Boots may be worn but must be suitable for school (no designer brands or coloured boots)

In the summer, school sandals may be worn.

PE Kit.

Black shorts

Irthington Village School blue PE polo shirt

1 pair of trainers/pumps for indoor use AND 1 pair of trainers for outdoor use

PE joggers or leggings (black, grey or navy)

Bags.

We strongly recommend that our school branded book bags and a draw string PE bags are purchased as these fit neatly in storage boxes.

Jewellery.

Pupils may wear a single pair of stud earrings that they must be able to remove for PE and games lessons. No other jewellery may be worn to school although pupils may wear watches.

Parents who wish their child to wear jewellery in keeping with their religion/ethnicity should contact the school direct to discuss the individual requirements.

Earrings and watches **must** be removed for PE/games lessons.

Do not allow your child to have pierced ears if they are unable to take them out and put them in easily

Hair cuts.

Long hair should be tied up whenever possible.

Extreme hairstyles are not permitted in school. We consider extreme: hair colouring; tramlines or patterns shaved into the head; shaven heads; styles where the sides are much shorter than the top; 'Mohawk' styles.
