

What is the Sports Premium?

The Government is providing funding of £150 million in academic years 2013/14, 2014/15 and 2015/2016 to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools. At Irthington Village school we have received the following amount of Sports Premium for each financial year;

We have spent our sports premium on new outdoor adventurous play equipment for KS1 and KS2. We have purchased new goal posts, footballs, replaced all the gym mats, bought new outdoor play equipment and storage boxes

The premium has been enhanced with funds from the School budget to provide CPD for staff including sports specific training (Rugby and cricket) and also for Forest School courses.

We also use the money to provide high quality sports coaches such as cricket coaches, Rugby coaches, African dance workshops and of course Rowan Alexander who teaches Football to each class every week.

Occasionally we use the funding to cover the cost of transport to venues for competitions (and lessons) and sometimes towards the cost of swimming lessons each autumn term for KS2. School subsidises a substantial amount towards the cost of the annual residential visits to outdoor and adventurous activity centres (we always keep the cost of these visits to less than £250 per child in order to make them accessible for all to enjoy), although this usually comes out of the general budget.

We have also spent some of the premium to buy new bikes and trikes for the EYFS children.

School had to close in March 2020 due to the National pandemic and so usual activities and related costs have not taken place. Swimming lessons have been postponed as have visits and the planned residential week. The remaining monies will contribute to the cost of further CPD, Sports equipment, resurfacing the playground, more bikes/trikes/scooters and transport to the residential and other sporting events.

All children benefit from professional coaching and take part in a variety of sporting events

All children have the opportunity to compete in inter school and county competitions

Staff are better trained to offer breadth and quality PE lessons

Resources are of a high quality, inspiring pupils to use them and take part in sporting activities

After school clubs include; Football, Rounders, Forest Schools, running, dance and KS1 team games during the course of the year.
